NARRATIVE

About 7:30 pm on Friday September 16, 2022 members of the Youth Violence Strike Force consisting of Officers D' Addieco, R. Monzon, S. Lopes and S. Panzavecchia in the VK07, under the supervision of VK911 Sgt. Hall-Brewster did make an arrest of Brandon Carrucini for Firearm related offenses in the area of 75R Malcolm X Boulevard, Madison Park Athletic Field.

Officers who are assigned to the Youth Violence Strike Force wear plain civilian clothing with black tactical ballistic vest with "Boston Police" insignia on the front chest as well as the back. In addition, Officers also had their department issued badges displayed on their outer most garment as well as their department issued body worn cameras (activated). Officers were operating Boston Police Department vehicle 9538 a black ford explorer with low profile lights (emergency lights on the inside of vehicle) along with the MDT (Mobile Data Terminal computer) in the

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center of the vehicle. These markings make it easily identifiable as a police vehicle. Officer S. Lopes was the operator, Officer Panzavecchia was the front seat passenger, Officer D'Addieco was in the left rear passenger seat, and Officer Monzon was the right rear seat passenger.

Officers were on patrol in the area of Malcolm X Boulevard and specifically the rear of Madison Park High School. Officers were well aware that the area is popular for people to congregate after hours and consume alcoholic beverages as well as smoke marijuana.



Officers have recovered multiple firearms from that specific area as well as have the knowledge of multiple shootings in that specific area. Some of the incidents include the following:

- I222022858, 103 Ruggles St 4-1-22
- I222022600, Shawmut and Marvin, 3-31-22
- I222039311, 9 Whittier St, 5-31
- I222055811, 75 Malcolm X Blvd, 7-25-22

While completing a traffic stop in the front of 75 Malcolm X Boulevard officers observed two individuals walking on the sidewalk then turn toward the walking path to the rear of the school. Officers observed one male to have a fitted hat on, long hair, white long sleeve shirt and jeans. Officers observed a second individual wearing a black hooded sweater and black sweat pants. Officers took note of these individuals because of their actions while walking past officers (individual all in black turning his head attempting to hide his face which is common for persons attempting to conceal their identify from law enforcement). Officers continued in their department motor vehicle down Malcolm X Blvd and then turned right onto Tremont St.

Officers entered the driveway area of Madison Park High School and pulled around to the rear of the school, specifically the Athletic Field. Officers observed staff from the Madison Park High School football team gathering items as they appeared to be leaving after a game or practice. Officers observed the same two individuals now seated at the benches at the top of the bleachers (this area is slightly elevated from where officers pulled into). Officers now observed the individuals to stop and focus their attention towards them. With both still in view officers decided to exit the department motor vehicle and walk in that general direction. While doing so officers could observe some quick movements around their mid-section of their body however officers could not fully observe exactly what was done so quickly.

Officers casually walked up the set of stairs in the direction of both individuals while continuously making observations. Officers observed that both were seated next to each other but on two sperate benches. Officers greeted both individuals and began to have a casual conversation with the two. During the initial encounter suspect

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who was later identified as Brandon Carrucini without prompt looked down at his mid-section and stood up. Officers observed that when Carrucini stood up he pulled the front of his shirt down. He began to walk toward Officer Panzavecchia who was standing at a distance, then immediately sat down at a different bench. Officers engaged both individuals in a conversation regarding congregating in that area. Their response was something in the effect of waiting to watch the football game.

Without being prompted the suspect later identified as [REDACTED] showed officers his social media in regards to the football game which was time stamped two hours ago, making it around 5:30pm.

While in conversation, Carrucini inquired on the bus schedule to Officer Panzavecchia where she was about to look it up for the suspect. Officers Monzon and D'Addieco walked to the side to further discuss observations they were making while having the casual conversation. Officer Monzon expresses his concern for the immediate separation from each other and explains possibly separating from the backpack on the table. Officer D'Addieco expresses to Officer Monzon his concern for Carrucini mid-section specifically his front belt buckle area. Officer D'Addieco does this by also motioning to his front buckle area and Officer Monzon looks down acknowledges.

While doing so, Officer Lopes has engaged [REDACTED] in a conversation in which at some point [REDACTED] mentions how he has prior recent firearm charges in fact he was involved in a shooting down at the Aquarium Station where he claims it to be a "Self Defense" situation. Officer Lopes was aware that the suspect [REDACTED] has not obtained the age of 21 therefore he could not legally possess a Firearm in the state of Massachusetts. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Officer D'Addieco then alerted Officer Monzon of his observation therefore both officers now aware that Robles has prior firearm charges.

At this time Officers Monzon and D'Addieco then began to slowly walk back towards both suspects who were still seated in separate locations. While Officer Lopes was having a conversation with [REDACTED] about his prior firearm incident Carrucini states something in the effect of "Yo the bus", however there was no possible way for him to observe a bus on Malcolm X Blvd due to an entire building blocking his view of the street. Carrucini then stood up and started to walk straight toward [REDACTED] now stands up and attempts to grab his backpack.

Officer Lopes along with all the officers on scene have attended multiple trainings through their careers and specifically attended training for Characteristics of an Armed Gunmen. Officers have all recovered multiple firearms from bags as well as from a person in either pockets or specifically waist areas as they become easily accessible and transportable in these locations.

While [REDACTED] stands up Officers Lopes inquires if [REDACTED] had any weapons on him or in the bag that he was grasping. [REDACTED] stated something in the effect of "oh no" and let go of the bag. Based on the following factors Officer Lopes feared that [REDACTED] was Armed and Dangerous and deemed a frisk was necessary:

- *The immediate separation of both parties upon approach*
- *The conversation around having recent firearm charges and more specifically how he was involved in a shooting*
- *The nervous behavior to include heavy breathing, pulsating carotid artery*

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- The admittance of [REDACTED] knowledge that the football game had ended hours ago
- Officers first hand knowledge of the specific area to have a high volume of firearm related incident as well as being a part of multiple firearm recoveries in the immediate area
- Officer Lopes training he has completed and prior experience recovering illegal firearms.

Officer Lopes then began to conduct a pat frisk of [REDACTED] backpack by squeezing it however do to the items in the bag Officer Lopes eventually had to open it to further his frisk. While conducting the frisk of [REDACTED] bag, Officer Monzon took note of his increased nervous behavior. Officer Monzon specifically observed [REDACTED] breathing pattern to increase as if he were just exercising for an extended amount of time. Officer Monzon then asked [REDACTED] if he had weapons on him while starting to raise his hands slowly in the air. Officer Monzon conducted the pat frisk for weapons to no avail. Officer Lopes concluded his pat frisk on the bag to no avail.

Simultaneously from the beginning of the frisk of [REDACTED] bag, Officers observed Carrucini standing looking toward Officer Lopes and Robles. Officer Lopes asked "how about you? did you do time to"? Carrucini began slowly walking and stated "Yeah but that was when I uh" Carrucini began to take off his bag and place it on the bench next to Officer Lopes. Carrucini then proceeded to attempt opening his bag. Officer D'Addieco immediately having a safety concern stopped him from doing so by saying "I do not want you reaching in there". Carrucini stated something in the effect of "oh I got you, do your thing" Based on that observation Officer D'Addieco began to pat frisk the bag for any potential weapons. Officer D'Addieco began squeezing the bag but due to the size and shape of items in the bag Officer D' Addieco was left with no choice but to unzip the bag to further his frisk. Officer D'Addieco did not find any weapons in Carrucini's bag.

Carrucini inquired if they were detained which Officer Panzavecchia began to explain that since there are no events taking place that they in fact are "Trespassing" (there are multiple signs in which state No Trespassing around the property). Officer D'Addieco then inquired by stating "so you said you've been arrested before to?". Carrucini responds [REDACTED]. Officers D'Addieco inquires on the seriousness of the charge in which Carrucini states [REDACTED] while shaking his head.

Officer D'Addieco then asked "do you have any weapons on you now?" in which Carrucini then blinks his eyes and nods while stating "nah". Carrucini then starts to stand up and place his bag on his bag while saying "I know my uhh like I really just don't think this is fair like" Officer D'Addieco then states "do you" in which Carrucini states "nah I don't". Officer D'Addieco asks "do you mind if I just pat frisk you really quick" in which Carrucini states "no I don't". Officer D' Addieco understood this as Carrucini did not mind if he was pat frisked. Officer D'Addieco and Panzavecchia now noticed a sudden change in Carrucini behavior. Officers observed his demeanor to be calm and talkative until officers inquired on weapons. Carrucini then appeared to become nervous as he was unable to finish sentences, looking around as if he had to leave at that moment. Carrucini even stated that he was "Scared" and Officer D'Addieco reminded him of the casual conversation they were just engaged in. Carrucini then stated that he would like officers to now call his mother as he started to blade the right side of his body away from Officer D'Addieco and look down toward the bench seat.

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Officer D'Addieco based on the following feared that Carrucini was indeed armed and dangerous as well as began to fear for the safety of officers as well as the general public deemed it necessary to conduct a pat frisk for a weapon, more specifically a firearm in the front belt buckle area:

- *Officers initial observation of immediate separation from suspect Robles.*
- *Officers observations of a bulge in the front waist section specifically the front belt buckle area as well as pulling down the front of his shirt after standing.*
- *Officers knowledge of suspect Robles recent involvement around Firearms*
- *Officers now knowledge of suspect Carrucini having a recent involvement around firearms*
- *Officers observations of immediate change of demeanor once asked about weapons and specifically asked to call his mother while blading his body away from Officer D'Addieco*
- *Officers prior trainings in which he had completed as well as his experience in recovering illegal firearms from persons in that specific area and knowing that persons who tend to carry a firearm unlawfully do not usually have a holster.*
- *Officer having first hand knowledge of the immediate area as well as being part of multiple firearm recoveries in the recent immediate area.*

Officer D'Addieco as Carrucini turned his body immediately took his right hand and went direct to the area of his concern which was the front waist area. Officer D'Addieco immediately felt the handle of a firearm and alerted the other officers of the presence of a firearm by stating [REDACTED] Officers were able to place both suspects into handcuffs without incident. Officer D'Addieco for the safety of Carrucini as well as officers asked "if the firearm was loaded" which while inquiring Carrucini stated multiple times "its on safety, its on safety" then proceeded to state "yes". Officer D'Addieco then safely removed the firearm from the suspects waist area and held onto it awaiting Youth Violence Strike Force Detectives to safely process it. Officer Panzavecchia demanded his License to Carry a firearm in which he stated he did not have one. Officer Panzavecchia then read Carrucini his Miranda Warnings from her Boston Police Department Miranda Card.

Simultaneously Officer Monzon demanded suspect [REDACTED] License to Carry a Firearm in which he stated that he did not have a license to carry a firearm. Officer Monzon then read [REDACTED] his Miranda Warnings from a Miranda Warning Card.

The B101F Officers Guerard and Aldridge responded on scene and transported Carrucini back to District B2 for Booking without incident.

Carrucini was charged with the following:

- **MGL 269:10H, Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, Second Subsequent**
- **MGL 269:10h, Unlawful Possession of Ammunition**

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- **MGL 269:10n, Carrying a Loaded Firearm on a Public Way**
- **MGL 269:10j, Possession of Firearm on School Grounds**

The VK911 Sgt. Hall-Brewster responded on scene along with the VK805 Detective Medina to recover and process the firearm. The firearm was a Taurus G2c 9mm with serial [REDACTED] containing one live round in the chamber and ten live rounds in the magazine. The firearm was logged into B2 Seized Firearm Log and secured into the B2 Firearm Safe.

Carrucini is currently on Probation [REDACTED]

Additional assisting YVSF members were Officers Bernazanni, J. Depina

Suspect [REDACTED] was FIOE'd and released from the scene.
