NARRATIVE

About 7:30 PM on Tuesday October 18, 2022, members of the Youth Violence Strike Force consisting of Officers Monzon, D'Addieco, S. Lopes, and Panzavecchia assigned to the VK07 along with State Police Troopers Caccamo, Hazelton, and Dugue under the supervision of Sgt. Hall-Brewster (VK911) and Sgt. Jones (VK908) did make an onsite firearm arrest of Mekhi Young and Terrance Porter in the area of Dearborn St and Eustis St. Roxbury.

Also responding was the VK10 Lekaditis/Stallings/Smerz, and multiple B2 units.

Officers who are assigned to the Youth Violence Strike Force were wearing plain civilian clothing with black tactical ballistic vest with "Boston Police" and "State Police Gang Unit" insignia on the front chest as well as the back. In addition, Officers also had their department issued badges displayed on their outer most garment as well as their department issued body worn cameras (activated). Officers were operating Boston Police Department vehicle 8567 a black ford explorer with low profile lights (emergency lights on the inside of vehicle) along with the MDT (Mobile Data

Terminal computer) in the center of the vehicle. These markings make it easily identifiable as a police vehicle. Officer D’Addieco was operating the vehicle, Officer Panzavecchia was the front seat passenger, Officer Lopes was the rear left seat passenger and Officer Monzon was in the rear right passenger seat. Officers were patrolling in tandem style patrol with State Police Trooper Hazelton operating, Trooper Caccamo seated in the rear seat , and Trooper Dugue seated in the front passenger seat following closely behind in an unmarked black State Police Cruiser.

Officers were on patrol in the area of Eustis St and Dearborn St due to ongoing firearm violence in the immediate area, the following are some of the many recent incident where Firearms were involved, and 9 people were confirmed shot in the recent months:

The Orchard Park housing community has been plagued by firearm violence in the recent months, causing the residents to fear of becoming a victim of firearm violence. This violence stemming from the strong gang feuds with rivaling neighborhoods and the Orchard Park Gang members. Due to the recent violent events officers have been focused on this particular area by increasing patrol in hopes to improve the neighborhood’s quality of life.

While traveling down Eustis St, officers observed three individuals walking on Eustis Street and turn onto Dearborn Street in the direction of Zeigler St. Officers observed one individual with a black rugrats cartoon hooded sweatshirt and two individuals with heavy winter jackets and baclava style masks. Officers observed all three to be hyper vigilant and immediately took note of Officer’s presence and continued to walk down Zeigler St. Officers continued down

Zeigler St. at which time all individuals crossed the street directly behind officer’s cruisers. The individual with the rugrats hooded sweatshirt began to separate himself from the other two individuals. It should be noted that the three individuals at first were observed walking together side by side. As they crossed the street, all three separated and began walking in a line. Officers began to engage in conversation with the three individuals from their cruiser, at which time the individual with the Rugrats hooded sweatshirt stated he was going to the store. Officer Lopes and D’Addieco observed a large bulge in the right pocket of the individual in the rugrats hooded sweatshirt and informed their partners of their observations. Officers attention were then drawn to the two other individuals later identified as Terrence Porter and Mekhi Young both active orchard park members, and active around firearms, slowing their pace and falling much further behind from the male with the rugrats hooded sweatshirt. They did this all while avoiding conversation with officers as they traveled next to them on the street. Officers also made note of Porter who had his hands in his jacket pocket as if holding onto an object. Based on the observations made by officers, their knowledge of the violence (shootings, person shots, and even homicides) taking place in that immediate area, combined with their training and experience officers believed that these individuals were of unlawful design and potentially armed and dangerous. Officers decided to conduct a threshold inquiry of these individuals to further investigate. Officer D’Addieco pulled the cruiser to the left of the sidewalk. Officers then observed the individual with the rugrats hooded sweatshirt to slow down his pace and look left and right as if looking for an escape route. Once officers exited their cruiser, all three individuals began to run.

Officer Monzon and Dugue began pursuing Young who immediately ran down Wheatley Way, turning right onto Eustis St. Trooper Dugue and Monzon observed Young reach into his right jacket pocket, lift his right and made a throwing motion to the right where a black object was seen thrown in the direction of the gated pathway. Immediately after officers heard what sounded like a medal object hit the pavement. Officer Monzon immediately went to the area where he observed Young throw the object and located a black firearm. Officer Monzon notified Channel 3 dispatch of a located firearm which was discarded by Young. Officer Monzon observed what appeared to be fresh scratch marks on the slide of the firearm which would be consistent with the firearm hitting and sliding on pavement. Officer Monzon also observed that the firearm appeared to be dry, and not wet, even though it had rained earlier that day. Trooper Dugue continued to pursue Young who began to run through the backyards from 120-140 Eustis St, jumping over the fence which is in place for the purpose of keeping individuals out, in the rear of 140 Eustis. Officers D’Addieco and Panzavecchia now traveling down Orchard Park St in their department cruiser observed Young run from the rear parking lot area of 140 Eustis St. Officer Panzavecchia and Dugue placed Young in hand cuffs. Officer Panzavecchia demanded to see Young’s License to Carry a firearm which he stated, “I Don’t gotta tell you nothing.” Officer Panzavecchia then read Young his Miranda rights from a card that she carries on her person. When officer Panzavecchia asked Young if he understood his rights he stated, “whatever bro. “

Simultaneously Officer S. Lopes and Trooper Caccamo began pursuing the individual in the rugrats sweatshirt and Porter who was wearing a black winter jacket and black pants. Officer Lopes observed Porter to be clutching his waist while running down Zeilger St towards Dearborn St, turning right into the rear parking lot of 250 Dudley Street. Porter then continued to the rear right side of 250 Dudley St, which abuts the fence of a vacant lot at 246 Dudley Street. Officer S. Lopes was able to maintain Porter in his line of site while traveling through the side of 250 Dudley. Due to the time of night, and the poorly lit area in this specific location, Officer S.Lopes was unable to see exactly what Porter was doing. Porter continued running to the front of 250 Dudley Street, exiting out of the front yard through the gate, running across to the rear of 247-249A Dudley St, and jumping over a fence at which time officers S. Lopes and Troopers Caccamo and Hazelton were able to place him into custody. It should be noted that Porter was wearing thick black cloth winter gloves. Officer S. Lopes notified channel 3 dispatch of his location and requested a Ballistics K9 to respond. Officers located Porter’s Identification on the side of 250 Dudley St. which was located on Porter’s flight path. Sgt. Jones while standing in the location where Porter’s identification was found, made further observation of a black item on the other side of the fence, adjacent to Porter’s ID. Sgt. Jones notified Officer S. Lopes of his observations, who then decided to climb the fence and canvas the area for any further discarded items or

weapons. Officer S. Lopes then located a black and gray firearm in the grass adjacent to where Porter’s Identification was located on the other side of the fence. The firearm appeared to be freshly discarded because it appeared to be dry, even though it had rained earlier in the day.

Officers transported Young and Porter back to District B2 for booking without incident.

The firearm located along Porter’s flight path was determined to be a 9mm ghost gun with 1 live 9mm round in the chamber and 14 rounds in the magazine.

The firearm discarded by Young at the intersection of Eustis St and Dearborn St was determined to be a Smith and Weston MMP Shield Serial#HXX9384 with 1 live 9mm round in the chamber and 7 live 9mm rounds in the magazine. It should be noted that this firearm was determined to be stolen out of Columbus PD on 11/24/20, Columbus PD notified via phone (706)653-3209.

Both firearms were photographed and processed by Detective Ball VK810, secured and logged in the B2 gun safe.
