NARRATIVE

About 10:36 pm, on Saturday 12/10/22, members of the Youth Violence Strike Force consisting of Officers Monzon, S. Lopes, and Panzavecchia, assigned to the VK07, under the supervision of Sgt. Jones (VK906) did make an onsite firearm arrest of Alexis Bourne and Samuel Frederick in front of 178 Tremont St.

Officers assigned to the Youth Violence Strike Force were wearing plain civilian clothing with black tactical vest with "Boston Police" insignia on the front chest as well as the back. In addition, officers also had their department issued badges displayed on their outermost garment as well as their department issued body worn camera (activated). Officers were operating Boston Police Department vehicle 8567, a black ford explorer with low profile lights (emergency lights on the inside of the vehicle) along with the MDT (Mobile Data Terminal computer) in the center of the vehicle. These markings make it easily identifiable as a police vehicle. Officer S. Lopes was operating the vehicle, Officer Monzon was in the front passenger seat, and Officer Panzavecchia was in the rear left seat.

Officers were on random patrol in the area of Tremont St in Downtown. As Officers were in traffic they observed three individuals standing in front of 178 Tremont St holding what Officers knew to be a bottle of alcohol, specifically a Teremana tequila bottle. At this point in time a loud noise occurred in traffic in front of where the Officers were positioned. All three parties immediately looked in the direction of where the loud noise came from in a concerned manner. One of the three individuals, who was wearing an Adidas black sweatpants with a gray hooded sweatshirt and black coat, grabbed the front right side of his waistband. Officer Monzon and S. Lopes attended the class Armed characteristics of an armed suspect. The reason why this was significant to the Officers was because the individual did what Officers know to be a security check.

The Officers have seen trends of people who illegally carry firearms where they carry them unholstered and in the front waist area. This area is known as "the box." The reason why people tend to illegally carry unholstered weapons in this area is because it is easily accessible.

After observing the individual who clutched at his waistband, the Officers were positioned in the farthest lane away from them. The Officers did not get out immediately due to the distance that was between the three individuals and the Officers. Officers believed that if they had gotten out in the farthest lane away from the individuals, not only would they be at a tactical disadvantage, but the three individuals would immediately disperse causing potential danger to the public in the immediate area.

This area at this time is crowded due to the night life of the city. This area attracts many people and tourists. At this time Officers not only observed a high level of motor vehicle traffic, but also a high level of pedestrian traffic walking close to and by the three individuals in question. Due to the high volume of pedestrians, tourists, and calls for service in this location, District A1 assigns additional units in this area to show presence and provide police services.

In an attempt to get closer to the three individuals the Officers decided it would be best to immediately circle back around and this time approach them quietly in the closest lane to the three individuals.

As the Officers drove by, and after observing a security check of one of the individuals Officers also observed that one of the parties had on a flat rimmed hat with the logo of the Florida Marlins team on it. The reason why this was significant was because Officers know that associates and members of the Franklin Field Gang tend to display this logo.

On the second approach, the Officers observed the same three individuals still standing in front of 178 Tremont St and confirmed that the bottle that they were holding was a Teramana tequila bottle. One of the individuals had a clear glass cup with the same liquid inside of it. This was a violation of Boston City Ordinance 16-12.28. As Officers parked their cruiser and stepped out, their attention was specifically drawn to the individual who initially clutched at his waistband.

Officer S. Lopes and Panzavecchia approached the male party, later identified as Samuel Frederick DOB 05/22/04, to further their investigation. Officer Monzon maintained an eye on the other two individuals. Officer S. Lopes began frisking Frederick and in the front waist band area he felt a hard metallic L shaped object that he knew through his training and experience to be a firearm. Frederick was immediately guided to the ground by Officers S. Lopes and Panzavecchia in order to place him in custody. Officer Monzon immediately switched with Officer S. Lopes, and he directed his attention to the other two individuals while Frederick was properly placed in handcuffs. Officers observed Tiyreek Mcafee, who is a known Franklin Field Associate, begin unzipping his coat and Officer Monzon informed his partners to watch him for Officer safety.

In handcuffs Frederick attempted to go in a fetal position in an attempt to block the firearm from being recovered by the Officers. For Officer safety and the safety of the public, to include pedestrians walking in the area, Officer Monzon

asked Frederick if the firearm was loaded. The reason for this was so it wouldn't discharge potentially harming the Officers, Frederick, or the pedestrians. Frederick stated that the firearm was not loaded. Officer Monzon was able to safely remove the firearm from his waistband. Officer Panzavecchia was able to place the firearm in the cruiser and locked the cruiser.

Due to the fact that a firearm had just been recovered from one of the three individuals and the fact that they were drinking in public, Officer S. Lopes requested additional units to the scene. Officer S. Lopes went to Mcafee in order to detain him. Simultaneously, Officer Panzavecchia approached the third party, later identified as Alexis Bourne, in order to detain her. As Officer Panzavecchia frisked Bourne, she felt a hard metallic L shaped object, that she knew through her training and experience to be a firearm. Bourne was immediately placed in handcuffs and the firearm was removed from her waistband by Officer S. Lopes. The second firearm was then placed and secured in the cruiser, and the cruiser was locked.

Officer Monzon demanded Frederick to produce his license to carry a firearm and he did not respond. Officer Monzon then read Frederick his Miranda warning from a Miranda card that Officer Monzon carries on his person.

Officer Panzavecchia demanded Bourne to produce her license to carry and Bourne stated, "I don't have one." Bourne was then mirandized by Officer Panzavecchia from a card that Officer Panzavecchia carries on her person.

Officer S. Lopes requested for a transport, a Youth Violence Strike Force Supervisor and Detective to the scene. Officers Patterson (K9 Officer), Garney (A103F), and Suttle (A421F) arrived on scene in order to transport both parties (Frederick and Bourne) to A1 for booking.

As Frederick was placed in cruiser # 8529 he began kicking the door of the cruiser. His actions of kicking the cruiser door caused it to be damaged. The door that he vandalized was the rear left passenger door. Frederick was then brought to A1.

Mcafee was released and properly FIOED. It should be noted that he was on a GPS Monitoring bracelet.

Sergeant Jones (VK906) and Detective Ridge (VK804) arrived on scene. Photos of the firearm were documented and the firearms were rendered safe by Detective Ridge.

The firearms recovered are as follows.

Gun 1 – recovered from Bourne was a Glock 19 (Ser# BSWU319) attached with a laser sight. It did not have a ballistic round in the chamber. The firearm had a black extended magazine with 28 assorted 9mm rounds of live ammunition.

Gun 2 – recovered from Frederick was a black and tan ghost gun attached with a laser. It did not have a ballistic round in the chamber. The firearm had a green extended magazine with 10 assorted 9mm rounds of live ammunition.

The bottle of Teramana was seized and placed in evidence. Both firearms were brought to A1 and placed in the gun locker. The bottle of Termana tequila was brought to A1 and placed in the evidence locker.

It should be noted that although Frederick stated that his name was Samuel Frederick, under AFIS (fingerprints) his identification came back as Salomon Frederick. Salomon is Samuel’s sibling. Through Officer knowledge, Officers know that the person they had in custody was in fact Samuel. To further prove this, on 1/1/21, Lulia Brunis who is the mother of both parties reported them missing (I212000703.) She then provided a photo of each Frederick brother. This confirmed that the person that the Officers had in custody was in fact Samuel and not Salomon.

A MGL City Ordinance violation ticket was completed and handed to both Frederick and Bourne.
